

Town of Cary Regular Monthly Board Meeting May 8, 2018
approved minutes

The regular monthly meeting for the Town of Cary Board was called to order at 7:00 p.m. at the Cary Town Hall by Chairman Jim Patrick after the Pledge of Allegiance. Those present were Chairman Jim Patrick, Supervisors Dennis Brunner, Mark Yetter, Treasurer Barb Schmidt, Clerk Patricia Lippert, Grader man Tim Ecker and 7 members of the public.

Dennis made a motion to approve the minutes, Mark seconded, motion passed.

Mark made a motion to approve the treasurer report, Dennis seconded, motion passed.

Chairman stated that Oakdale Electric Company as of May 1 had not started work yet on Wolf Road, most likely because of the heavy snow.

Jake Hahn, representing district 8 from the Wood County Board talked to the group about why the County was closing their garage at Pittsville. He stated that the salt shed would stay open because the State paid for that. When someone wants salt, they will have to call ahead and schedule the loading. The county has found that sometimes salt brine works better than salt & sand.

Public Input: none

Old Business: Brian Slinkman representing **Country Disposal, LLC** was there for the contract signing. The committee will send a letter with contract details and a pick-up date calendar to each permanent resident.

Gas Smell in Shop: Corrected improper pipe joint in wall space, done years ago. Changed regulators on tank and buildings, one leaked and one expired.

New compressor was installed. Old one can be put out on bid.

Pressure washer installed. The old one will be junked.

Crack repair Steffek and Cary Rock. The lowest bid the town received was from Fahrner Asphalt for \$3,762. Mark made a motion to accept the bid, Dennis seconded, motion passed.

Magnesium Chloride: bid was received from Wisconsin Salt Solutions. After much discussion, Dennis made a motion and Mark seconded, motion passed. The township will buy 1 load of Magnesium Chloride this year. It will be applied in front of people's houses, driveways and intersections. The price is \$1.02 a gallon.

The township received notice from Wood County we did not receive enough snow in April to be eligible for reimbursement for snow removal from emergency government.

Equipment: The correct mounting accessories for the **Diamond Mower disk** were received and installed. Tim used it and said it worked well. Minor repairs were done to the grader and cruz-air.

Roads: Johnson Road . Laser work was done on the road by Brian & Jim Patrick. Results from laser level showed there was adequate slope for drainage.

Border Roads The townships of Hiles and Rock are now current with agreements. A representative from Town of Wood was present at meeting. The border road agreement with Town of Wood is still under discussion.

Mowing Contract: JJ's bid for mowing grass and cutting brush for the next 3 years was accepted 2018-2020 at \$65 per hour for roadside grass and \$75 per hour for mowing brush. Grading of roads in the **Town of Hiles and Rock** Bids were requested and submitted for the work.

Road Inspection will be held May 12th. The Board and Tim Ecker grader man will meet at 8:00 a.m. at the Cary Town Hall. The meeting will adjourn to travel the Town roads.

Road Damage and Repair in the Town of Cary. The State Statutes 86.02 and 86.021 list the penalties for road damage. The Town of Cary will complete any repair to the road or ditch as necessary and will bill the responsible party/parties.

Snow plowing: Dead end roads without permanent residents will be the last places to be done. The Town has 3 weeks to remove snow as listed in SS 893.83

Also discussed was mowing town hall lawn and cleaning town hall.

Pay Bills: Dennis made a motion to pay bills and Mark seconded, motion passed. Checks written out were #9024-9031 for the amount of \$3,793.67.

Next meeting will be Monday June 11, 2018 at the Cary Town Hall at 7:00 p.m.

Mark made a motion to adjourn and Dennis seconded, motion passed.
